Donna Lilly announced the Drug and Alcohol Conference will be held at U.S.I. on Thursday, May 27th and Friday, May 28th.

The Boom Squad's preshow performance for the Super bowl in Indy was successful. They performed twice and were asked to come and perform in Indy again at future events.

Presentations

Ramona Gilmore from the Evansville Housing Authority spoke briefly about the agency and their efforts they have taken towards keeping the community healthy. EHA holds the program Life Support which consists of workshops for preventing and educating the community about substance abuse, homelessness and communicable diseases. Ramona also spoke about EHA's program ELITE where young teens participate in health fairs, school programs and their current Orange Ribbon event in their efforts of getting more parents involved.

Committee Reports

<u>Prevention:</u> The next People in the Know is tentatively planned for March 22nd where a discussion about parent awareness throughout the community will be held. Topics will include drug trends hitting the Evansville area and warning signs for parents for teen alcohol and drug use. The Committee hopes to collaborate with the Drug Task Force on information, stats and a possible presentation.

Treatment:

There was a discussion held on possible topics, areas to discuss and contacting a speaker for the 2012 Faces of Change. A new location was also discussed and Donna will get more information on the discussed location. Laura is continuing to contact U.S.I about the surveys and check from 2011's event.

<u>Law Enforcement:</u> Countermeasure fees for January were \$14,498.38. In Vanderburgh County, there were 5 alcohol and drug related vehicle crashes; 1 resulted in injuries with 3 people being injured. There were 12 DUI arrests in the month of January and 7 minor consumptions. The EXCISE police worked in Indy during super bowl week and made "dozens upon dozens of arrests."

Project Updates/Discussion

The Taste if Southern Indiana will be Sunday, April 15th from 6-8 in the evening at Cambridge Golf Club. Tickets are \$25 in advance and \$35 at the door. Laura will have tickets at every SAC meeting from now until then for purchase or you can call/email Laura for tickets as well.

Wally is in contact with local politicians in efforts to have SAC use the Centre for no charge. Larry Bucshon's office has contacted SAC and would like to support this event in any way.

Ashlee our SAC Intern has contacted Hacienda on Green River Rd. and set up a "Hacienda Gives Back Night" on May 7th. All orders that are specified to support the SAC will have 20% of the ticket price given back to the Council when once orders total over \$300. Ashlee will have SAC coupons available at the April and May Council meetings.
